



## MA in Contextual Theology

*validated by the University of Manchester*

### **new ministerial formation and church leadership option**

Within the MA programme at Luther King House we have developed an option for those embarking on ministerial formation who already have a degree in theology or a related subject, and wish to pursue their studies at M level whilst covering the basic requirements for ministry within their own denomination.

Full-time study over two years, part-time over three-five years, consisting of:

- a part-time MA in contextual theology validated by the University of Manchester
- additional college-based tuition appropriate to the form of ministry
- a supervised placement
- participation in the learning and worshipping community at Luther King House.

#### **Details of the programme**

- a compulsory module on 'Reflective practice in church and community' – taught in three 2-day blocks through the academic year.
- three taught modules in areas such as biblical studies, liturgy and worship, pastoral care, doctrine and ethics, and mission. Students are encouraged to select appropriate modules, depending on their previous education and experience, with the guidance of their college.
- most teaching on Mondays on a rolling two-year programme, although some modules can be taken at weekends or as summer schools.
- during teaching weeks full-time students will normally be expected to be at Luther King House for two days per week (at present Mondays and Tuesdays) for MA teaching, library and tuition time, reflection on placement, and to be part of a learning and worshipping community
- a minimum of 50 hours placement or field work experience per module in a supervised placement near to the student's place of residence, negotiated and monitored by their sponsoring college.
- placement assessed by input into module assignments (especially reflective practice), a log of hours worked, and an annual reflective report. Individual colleges may have additional review processes in place.

#### **International students**

This option within the programme is open to international students studying in the UK on a Tier 4 international student visa provided that they complete the programme on a full-time basis over two years.
